Meeting Minutes # 2 – Wednesday, February 1st, 2017 10:00am – 11:30am North Shore Community Health Center

The meeting began with a presentation from a representative of the American Medical Association, Janet Williams. She is a Senior Program Manager and has a focus of diabetes prevention and hypertension. Her presentation was about the importance of prediabetes screenings and the CDC Diabetes Prevention Program. Janet and a colleague from NorthShore University is willing to come to Lake County and give presentations and/or give grand rounds. At the end of the presentation time was available for questions. Arlene inquired about YMCA and how they can be leverage to implement a DPP in the Lake County community. YMCA is the largest DPP contributor in the state but Lake County only has one YMCA and its headquarters Metro Chicago YMCA opted not to participate in providing DPP.

Team Announcements

In a partnership with Mano a Mano and Waukegan Library Diana is training community health workers in DEEP. Once the class begins there will be a total of 10 sessions and Rosalind Franklin will provide free screenings for participants

Elvis is looking in the future to work with Condell's physician liaison to increase screenings for prediabetes and diabetes.

The North Shore Health Center will begin another DPP pilot in March. They will recruit from list of people who are only prediabetic. This program will be an opportunity to create a positive feedback to the providers and follow-up screenings for participants. Because the health centers do not see a lot of Medicare patients they are no able to take advantage of the CMS benefit.

Next Steps

Every item on the agenda was not addressed. The team will work on some items before the next meeting. The team will finish creating the purpose statement through email correspondence and come up with ideas for Diabetes Alert Day before March 1st meeting. During the next meeting the statement of purpose will be completed and we will start exploring evidence-based interventions to achieve the goals and objectives.
